A Message From The President

Brothers of Kappa:

As Kappa Kappa Kappa moves closer to 150 years of service at Dartmouth, I am glad to report that the past months have proved to be a continuation of the successful traditions combining the College and the House. We have just completed a successful rush period led by Rush Chairman Sam Braverman '88. Eighteen honorable young men pledged Tri-Kap and they all seem to have the potential to become especially strong brothers. In addition to our freshman class, Bill Grace '89, Chuck Berwick '89, and Paul Zimmerman '90 all sank at the House during the past year. The quality of this year's class is very encouraging as the College ponders delaying rush until sophomore year. This decision should be made within the next month.

We have recently taken steps to improve the quality of the interior and exterior of the House. During the beginning of the Winter term the second floor halls and bedrooms were recarpeted. At the end of Spring term we plan to replace the basement floor-at present we are evaluating different proposals for this renovation. The Seniors have announced plans to purchase a new jukebox as their gift for the House (the old one can unfortunately best be described as "disabled"). All of the shutters on the House have recently been taken down and painted, and look much improved.

Several cultural programs have recently been held to complement our regular Friday afternoon 'tails. Four professors have spoken on topics ranging from "The History of Fraternities at Dartmouth" to a discussion on the "Western Tradition in a College Curriculum." College counsel Sean Gorman spoke on "Fraternity Liabilities." We also hosted receptions for Al Haig and Jack Kemp, although we were rebuffed in efforts to have some of the Democratic Party candidates speak.

I am also grateful for the support exhibited for the Phil McInnis Recognition fund. The portrait of Phil will soon hang proudly in the House. Also, the first Senior award in his honor will be given this term.

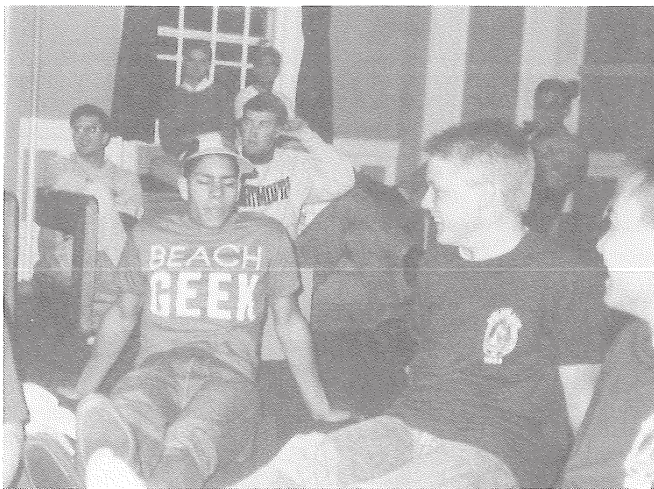
This spring opens with the house fielding two softball teams which both have real chances for athletic glory. In addition, the annual Kappa Open golf tournament is expected to be hotly contested.

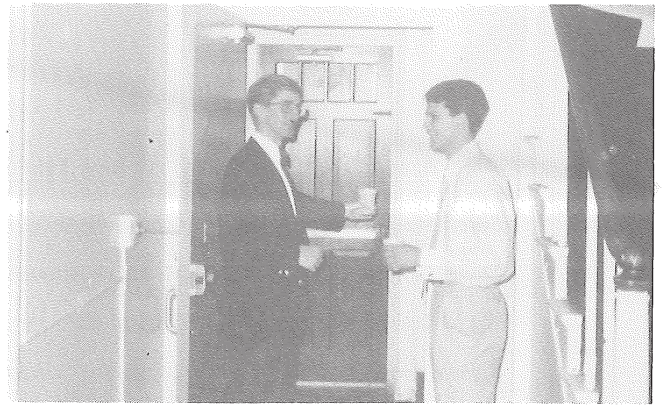
Alumni News

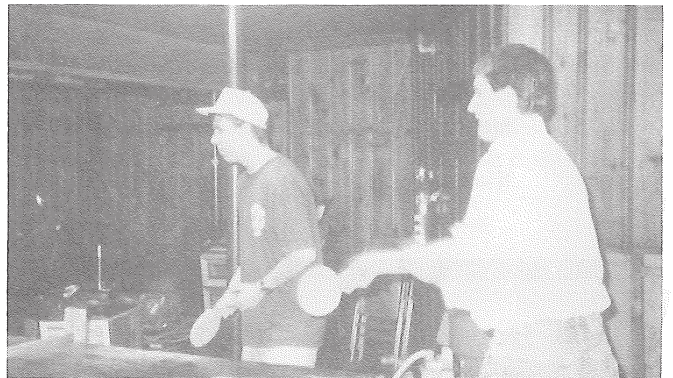
Pledge Keith Dangleis '91 looks on at unhappy classmate and Fellow Pledge John "Beach Geek" Kulas '91.
